INDIA'S UNRIVALLED NATURAL ATTRACTIONS

The natural attractions in India are almost unrivalled in the world, ranging from pristine forests, snow-clad Himalayas, montane grasslands, golden and silver deserts, rivers, lakes, wetlands, mangroves, beaches, volcanoes and corals, housing tremendous biodiversity. Besides, we have the mega-fauna consisting of iconic species such as tigers, lions, elephants, rhinos, leopards, wild buffaloes, Indian bison (gaur), etc. and more than 1200 species of birds.

ADVENTURE TOURISM INDIA'S SIGNIFICANT GEOGRAPHICAL ADVANTAGE

India has significant geographical advantage owing to its rich natural & eco-tourism resources:

- 70 per cent of the Himalayas
- 7,000 kms of coastline
- Among the one of the three countries in the world with both hot and cold deserts
- Ranks 10th in total area under forest cover
- Ranks 6th in terms of number of recognized UNESCO Natural Heritage sites

India has tremendous potential to attract adventure tourists from different parts of the World. From North to South and East to West, the geographical conditions of the country provide a competitive edge regarding the development of adventure tourism opportunities.

Adventure tourism is a type of niche tourism where exploration or travel involves some degree of risk (real or perceived), may require special skills, physical effort. Adventure tourism can be any tourism activity that includes physical activity, cultural exchange, and connection with nature. Adventure tourism experiences are generally divided into two types hard adventure and soft adventure.

NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR ADVENTURE TOURISM

In order to provide impetus to the development of adventure tourism in the Country, Ministry of Tourism has formulated National Strategy for adventure tourism. The Ministry has further notified Indian Institute of Travel and Tourism Management as Central Nodal Agency for Adventure Tourism to provide technical support to the Ministry of Tourism. The Ministry of Tourism has also set up a National Board for Adventure Tourism under Secretary (Tourism) and comprising of Central Ministries, States and Industry Stakeholders to provide guidance for the development of the sector.

STRATEGIC PILLARS

Following strategic pillars have been identified for development of sustainable tourism, adventure tourism and ecotourism:

- (i) State assessment, ranking and strategy
- (ii) Skills, capacity building and certification
- (iii) Marketing and promotion
- (iv) Strengthening adventure tourism safety management framework
- (v) National and state level rescue and communication grid
- (vi) Destination and product Development
- (vi) Governance and Institutional Framework

ADVENTURE TOURISM IN NORTH EAST REGION

The northeast is an adventure playground, with lofty Himalayan peaks, high passes, and glacial lakes all around, as well as lush jungles, rivers, and valleys. North East India offers a variety of exciting activities such as trekking, rafting, kayaking, safari, and mountain biking, among others.

In order to develop the full potential of adventure tourism in North East, the States will share their current policies and future plans for adventure tourism. The Industry will provide feedback on the same to help the States develop better strategies for promoting adventure tourism in the North East.
